St. Paul the Apostle Church To Host Pet Adoption Festival On Manhattan's Upper West Side

New York, NY – April 4, 2005 – Cats and dogs and rabbits, oh my! That's what's in store for New Yorkers who stop in on Saturday, April 9, at the Pet Adoption Festival at St. Paul the Apostle Church on Columbus Avenue between 59th and 60th Streets, between 12 noon and 5:00 pm.

Dozens of darling and dashing Little New Yorkers, including cats, dogs and, yes, even rabbits from area animal shelters and rescue groups, will be wiggling and wagging their way into the hearts of New Yorkers who are looking to add a family member or two this spring. Among the groups lined up to show animals at the event are A Cause for Paws, Animal Haven, Animals Can't Talk (ACT), Bobbi & the Strays, Kitty Karetakers of Queens, Linda's Feral Cat Assistance, Miss Rumple's Orphanage, NYC Animal Care & Control, and Rabbit Rescue & Rehab – all of which are members of the Mayor's Alliance for NYC's Animals.

Adopters and others attending the event will have the opportunity to get their pet-related questions answered by a veterinarian, a groomer, and an animal trainer, who will be onhand at the event. New Yorkers also will have the opportunity for the first time to meet Maddie, the human-size mascot for Maddie's Fund, which provides funding for many Mayor's Alliance programs.



The St. Paul the Apostle Church's Pet Adoption Festival is the first in a series of multigroup Pet Adoption Festivals sponsored by the Mayor's Alliance taking place around New York City from now through autumn. The goal: to bring animals to the people and increase pet adoptions from shelters and rescue groups, especially among families and individuals who might be reluctant to visit an animal shelter.
